

Frequently Asked Questions

How does the program work?*

You must wear a transmitter on your ankle. You will be eligible for time outside of your home on Tuesday and Thursdays from 9am to 1pm only. If you provide required documentation additional time may be given for work or school.

How much does it cost?

It costs \$7/day, which equals \$98/every two weeks.

What are the requirements?

Pending approval, each applicant will be required to:

- Meet eligibility requirements (residency, equipment, etc.)

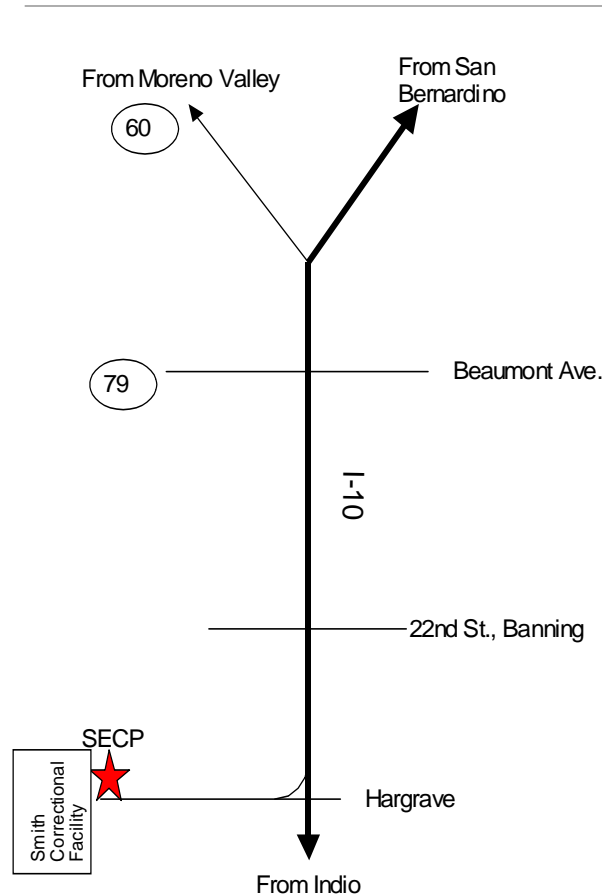
- Provide a current telephone bill, most recent pay stub, and proof of enrollment in alcohol, drug, and/or counseling programs (if applicable).

Introduction

“A confinement option for low-risk offenders”

Purpose:

Supervised Electronic Confinement Program (S.E.C.P.) offers a safe, cost effective, alternative for selected minimum security, low-risk, non violent offenders; subject to approval of the Riverside County Sheriff's Department.

Advantages:

Participating offenders can:

- Complete sentence in their own home
- Keep current job
- Receive their own medical care
- Attend Counseling

Application Process

If you feel you are qualified for the program, you need to fill out a green application and submit it to the Pod Officer. It will be returned to you to let you know if your application has been accepted or denied. If you have been accepted, a Deputy will interview you. Whomever you will live with will need to call the SECP office to set up an appointment to bring in the required items. They will also need to make arrangements to pick you up once you are released to SECP.

Required Items prior to release:

- Copy of most current telephone bill
- \$98 to cover the first two weeks on the program.
- All co-residents 18 and over must sign a cohabitant waiver agreeing to program rules.

*You must have basic analog telephone service. No Call Waiting, Voice Mail, Call Forwarding, Call Blocking, Caller ID or “Dial up” internet etc.

Phone service can not be through a cable or internet provider.

You must disconnect:

- Answering Machines
- Cordless Phone
- Fax Machines

Eligibility

Eligible offenders:

- Live in Riverside County or within a reasonable distance.
- Have a working telephone with no added features on the line
- Able to pay the daily fee
- Agree to adhere to the rules, regulations, and requirements of the S.E.C.P.

You are not eligible if:

- You have behavior problems such as: excessive failure to appear violations, or have been previously terminated from SECP for non-compliance.
- You have violent charges

Failure to comply:

Failure to comply with the rules/regulations of the S.E.C.P. will result in immediate termination from the program and you will be returned to custody to complete the remainder of your time.
